Finance Activity

@ Financial Statistics - General:

- Revenue posted: \$6,623,936,542.79
- Expenditures posted: \$7,152,617,028.27

@ Financial Statistics – Accounts Payable:

- Direct-pay postings entered in SCEIS: 86,587
- Postings interfaced into SCEIS: 154,757
- SCEIS AP processed invoices: **422,157**

HR/Payroll Activity

@ Payroll Statistics:

- Total amount of payroll processed: \$456,777,579
- SCEIS issued a total of 342,092 checks to pay 48,870 state employees

MySCEmployee Portal Statistics:

 State employees logged into MySCEmployee 26,847 times to view pay stubs, request/approve leave, enter/approve time, etc.

- © SCEIS MM & MMO Conducts Staff Assist Visits (SAV)
 - The initial SAV is a discussion of our 'discoveries' and the agency's pain points. To derive the 'discoveries,' we conduct an analysis of how the agency is using the SCEIS system to conduct their purchasing processes



Milestone & Activities Cont'd First Quarter 2012



SCEIS MM and MMO team completed 17 Staff Assist Visits (SAV) in the following 7 agencies:

- DDSN: 2 SAVs

3 training sessions: shopping cart, bidding, purchase orders

DHEC: 3 SAVs

DJJ: 1 SAV

– DNR: 2 SAV

– DOC: 2 SAVs

- 2 training sessions: 1 shopping cart and 1 teach-back to shopping cart for DOCs new trainer

Milestone & Activities Cont'd First Quarter 2012



 ZMRBR "3-way match" was implemented on Monday, April 2.

The ZMRBR process:

- Upon entry of an invoice, the ZMRBR transaction checks the quantify of goods received and price being paid against the purchase order quantity and price for a 3-way match.
- If a 3-way match exists, the invoice is presented for approval and payment without further intervention.
- If a 3-way match does not exist, the discrepancy will be shown in ZMRBR report and will have to be investigated and corrected by the agency.



Preparation for FY2012 Year-End SCEIS



SCEIS Year-End Training:

- SCEIS Training Team is preparing for year-end training:
 - Distributed a survey to gather information on the number of users who will need to attend year-end training
 - Gauging the number, capacity and types of training sessions based on survey responses
- SCEIS will offer multiple sessions of three year-end courses:
 - CO500: SCEIS Introductory Year-End Training
 - CO500R: SCEIS Refresher Year End Training
 - CO500A: SCEIS Grant Year-End Workshop
- Training dates are planned for the month of May

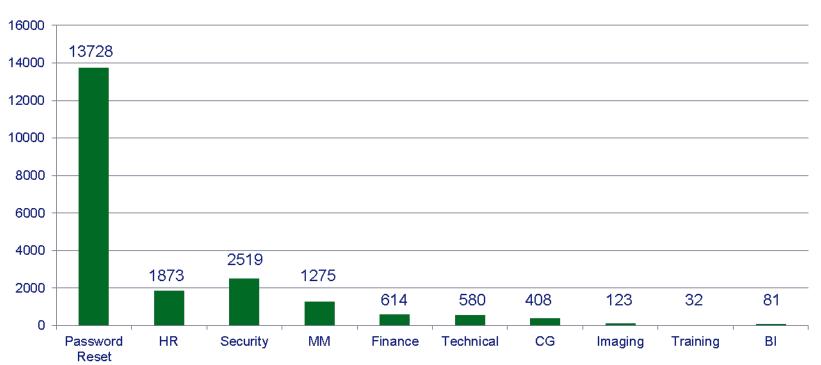


Help Desk Report: First Quarter 2012

All Areas for 1st Qtr. 2012

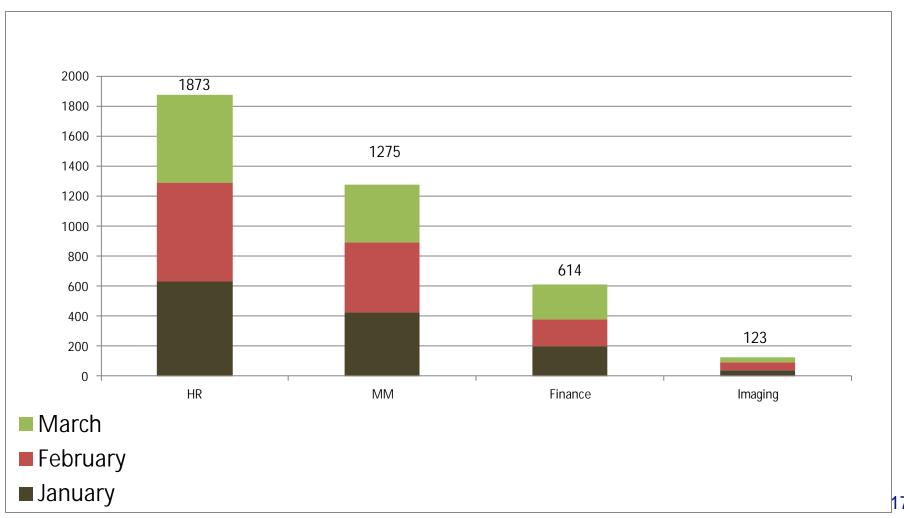

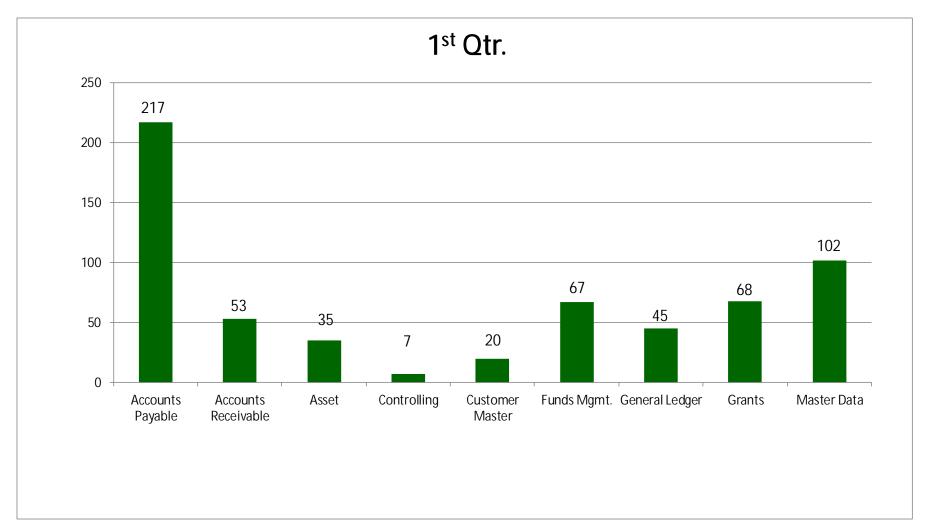
SCEIS Service Desk Tickets by Functional Area & Month





2012 Finance Tickets








2012 Materials Management Tickets



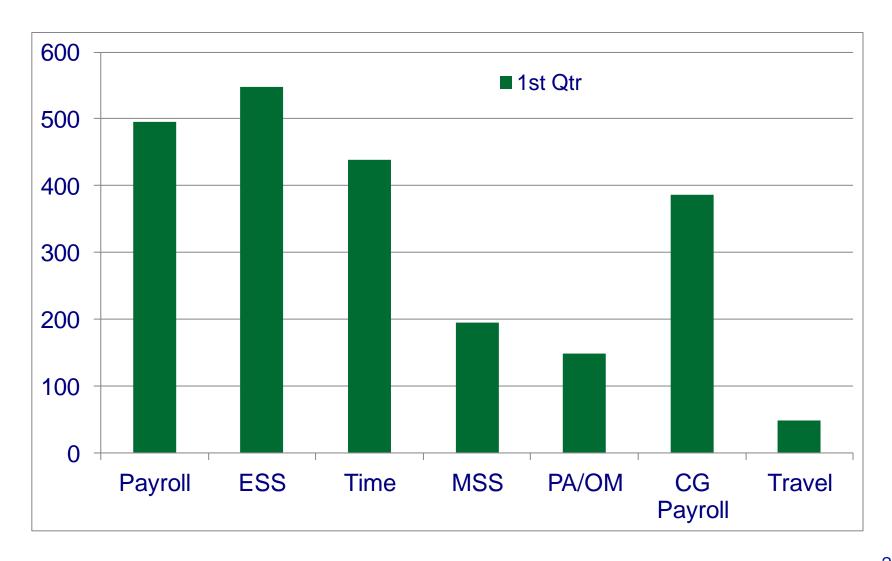

2012 HR/Payroll Tickets

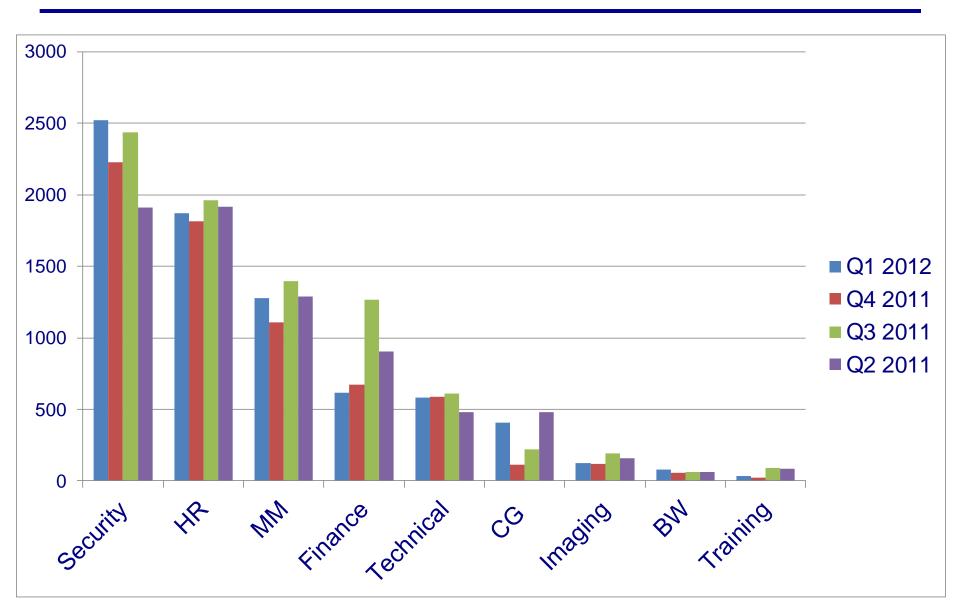

AMS Provider Report



- @ AMS Application Management Services
- © Contract for system Operations and Maintenance
 - Finance
 - Human Resources & Payroll
 - Materials Management
 - Reporting
 - Technical Support (system development, software upgrades, repairs)
- Represents shift away from individual Beeline contracts to a firm, fixed-price contract with one vendor



AMS Provider Report



- @ Beeline contracts cost between \$11 and \$14 million during system implementation
- @ AMS Contract for 48FTE is \$5.2 Million Annually

- @ Contract Awarded on April 13, 2012, to IBM
- @ Goals
 - Provide our SCEIS team with necessary resources to support system and end users
 - Knowledge Transfer

© Contract includes a "Rate Card" for large projects and enhancements that exceed the scope of basic system Operations and Maintenance

SCEIS Budget Update







- **@ Amount Requested:** \$ 17,405,977.00
- **@ Amount Received:** \$ 9,608,138.00

@ Impact on SCEIS:

- Reduction in experienced SAP consulting staff
- Activities primarily focused on basic maintenance and support
- Agencies are asked to fund enhancement requests
- DSIT has funded much of SCEIS shortfall





@ Amount Requested:

- \$14.9 Million in Recurring Funds
- \$2.45 Million in Non-Recurring Funds

Recurring Funds

Salaries for SCEIS staff: \$5.40 million

– AMS contract: \$5.25 million

Software Maintenance/Hosting: \$3.94 million

Other (Rent, Supplies, etc.) \$350,000





- Recurring funds represent baseline operational budget.
- This amount includes limited funding for special projects.
- @ Agencies will be asked to fund project costs for agency-specific enhancement requests submitted and approved by the Change Advisory Board (CAB).





Non-Recurring Funds:

- \$1.4 Million for SRM Upgrade (Shopping Cart/Procurement System)
- \$850,000 for Hardware Upgrades
- \$200,000 for Additional Agency Training





- © SCEIS funding included in Governor's Budget and approved by the House
- @ B&C Board Staff now working with Senate Finance on funding request
- @ Budget Module (\$2.5 million) has been requested by State Budget Office





@ SCEIS cost vs. STARS cost

- 2003 Business Case Study estimated that cost to maintain STARS and over 170 different Finance/HR systems to be just under \$12 million
- Business Case Study estimated cost to maintain SCEIS to be \$12.3 Million





@ Impact of Not Funding SCEIS

- SCEIS is not an internal B&C Board system
- Statewide Financial/HR system
- Not funding the system has statewide implications
- There is no backup system; without SCEIS the state cannot pay employees, procure goods and services, or pay vendors
